From the Fire Chief

On behalf of your Fire District, I would like to thank the citizens of Keizer for voting to approve our Fire District Bond in November of 2015 to buy emergency equipment such as Fire Trucks and Ambulances.

The Keizer Fire District issued its first series of general obligation bonds on April 5th, 2016. The District's bonds are tax-free and rated A1 by Moody's Investor Service. Working with a financing team of Piper Jaffray, the bond underwriter, Special District Association of Oregon Advisory Services, the District's municipal advisor and Hawkins, Delafield & Wood, LLP (bond counsel) the bonds were well received in the capital markets.

The District entered the bond market with its \$4 million bond issue and the demand for the bonds was in excess of \$9.8 million. With such strong demand for the District's bonds, the District was able to obtain an all-in interest cost 2.70% for 20-years vs. what was originally estimated at 3.90%. Additionally, with such market demand investors were paying a premium to purchase the bonds resulting in the District reducing the size of the bond offering to \$3,770,000 and still obtaining nearly \$4 million in proceeds preserving the District's bond authorization approved by the voters.

Our timing in the market, the management of our offering by our financial representatives, and the attractiveness of tax free municipal bonds, strong credit rating, all contributed to this very successful sale. The proceeds from the sale of bonds will fund emergency equipment for Keizer fire such as ambulances and fire trucks. This chain of events all saved money for our tax payers. Thank you for your support to keep us equipped and operational. We work hard with you in mind.




9/11 Remembrance





In 2015, Keizer Firefighters responded to 4,512 calls for service, only 71 were for fires. In the 67 years that Keizer Firefighters have been serving the citizens of Keizer there has been a slow, but constant shift in the type of calls that firefighters respond to.

The District responded to 3,731 medical emergency requests. This category of call covers people who are injured in accidents or suffering from medical conditions such as heart attacks. The remaining 558 calls were for motor vehicle crashes, lift assists, odor investigations and other types of calls for service.
